

NEIGHBORS TOGETHER:

PROMISING PRACTICES TO STRENGTHEN RELATIONS WITH REFUGEES AND MUSLIMS

BUILD RELATIONSHIPS BEFORE AND AFTER CRISES

Take a long-term approach to building relationships across race, religion, and ethnicity in your community. Recognize that there may be misunderstandings and fears in your community, and work proactively to build bridges across diverse groups of people in order to create a more welcoming climate and prevent potential backlash. This is the perfect opportunity to build multiethnic and interfaith alliances; however, be sure to invest in these relationships before and after crises, rather than only relying on them during the harder times.

SHARE YOUR STORY

Share your story of how your community is welcoming refugees and Muslims to create an echo chamber of positive community building efforts to counter the negative stories that we so often hear. PARTNERSHIPS WITH LOCAL INSTITUTIONS

Partnerships with local institutions maximize your impact by getting your message in front of a wider range of receiving community members. Partners can include schools, police, local businesses, the city, and others. Partners could cohost events, publish letters of support, and even work to institutionalize welcoming measures.
